





Annual Report AllKidsShouldPlay 2019



2019 was a year of follow-up steps and extension of activities and co-workers in Mambo. Under the wings of the Tanzanian NGO Makini, more and more of the organisation was transferred to the young people in Mambo. With a number of adults in the background as mentors. In the Netherlands, the support foundation AllKidsShouldPlay remained active with money and co-thinking and contra-thinking. Meanwhile a large group of motivated children now runs most of the activities by themselves. They have made trips to Tanga, Dar es Salaam, Pangani, Lushoto, Moshi, Arusha and several villages near Mambo. These are great experiences for the children (5 to 15 years) and young people (15 to 22 years old). As a result, they have become

proud, inventive, and bold. They help each other, work together, and they appreciate each other. Several young people have become motivated to go back to school or start vocational training or further education. These children and young people contribute positively to the society of Mambo.

Circus

The circus has done over 100 gigs in recent years. They do this independently and have great self-confidence. The money they earn from the shows they save to be able to make road trips and to inspire other children with their performances wherever they come.



In 2019, the circus children have trained weekly every Saturday and Sunday. The circus made a multi-day trip to Dar es Salaam in January. There they trained and performed with youngsters from Makini. In April they performed in Madala, a village 7km South of Mambo. Furthermore, there were performances on World AIDS Day and Africa Child Day. And lots of gigs for guests of Magumba Hotel in Mambo.



Cooking

Just like the previous year, there was cooking for groups. In 2019, six girls and two young mothers cooked for the circus children on weekends. And through the week for the Barabarani group leaders. We paid for the cooks and the food.

Barabarani

Barabarani, or playing on the street, is offered to the youngest on three afternoons a week. This is now done in eight districts in the village.



To give the children a better start when they go to school, experienced trainers play, sing and read with the toddlers. Every experienced trainer is assisted by a trainee.

Education

Our activities in the field of education have expanded:

- ✓ Computer lessons to Form 4 school leavers (last year of high school)
- ✓ English lessons for Standard 7 (last year of primary school) school leavers, for circus children and for some young people in Mambo
- ✓ We paid an extra biology teacher for Sunga Secondary School (a larger village south of Mambo) for two months
- ✓ For two students in Form 4 we paid the accommodation costs of Sunga Secondary School
- ✓ We paid for accommodation, school clothes and travelling costs for four students for the Masanga Juu Secondary School
- ✓ We sponsored all costs for two students so that they could go to a well-regarded Soni Islamic Seminary Secondari School (near Lushoto, 35 km south of Mambo)
- ✓ We helped and advised a student who was taking the standard 4 adult education exam and who will continue for the Standard 7 exam in 2020.

- ✓ We made a donation for the graduation day celebration of Mambo elementary school.

Sports

Football

We have sponsored two footballs for the football tournament in August/September 2019, which was organized by Omari, who joined the village administration.

We have set up the organization of a youth football league. This has yet to start because the rainy season made the start impossible.

Cycling

Every Saturday and Sunday a group of children and young people, mainly boys, go cycling but we also try to encourage the girls to cycle. Already a number of times, one of the more experienced cyclists has guided tourists from Magumba hotel on bike rides through the beautiful mountainous surroundings. The guided cycling tours and renting of bicycles could become one of the companies in the future.



The maintenance of the bicycles is still periodically taken care of by a boy originally from the village.

Coaching

The boy who trained as a cycle repair man in Arusha with coaching from Gijs, has now

finished. He got a job in a bike shop in a nearby village.



All 25 trainers and supervisors of the organization, all from the village of Mambo, received continuous coaching from Gijs and the social worker Omari and teacher Noel. In the course of 2019, Omari has been replaced by another social worker: Lulu, because we wanted to add a woman to the coaching team.



Companies

We started a sewing workshop, Kushona, for some girls. We paid for a workspace and bought machines and materials. The next step is for two girls to start running the sewing workshop.

Building



A first impression of the design

Preparations for the construction of the training centre have started under the guidance of Frank Boehm, an architectural engineer/architect, who deals with all the work professionally. He does it entirely voluntarily, because when he got to know the village last year he was very impressed with the work of AllKidsShouldPlay. For the entire construction process, a support team is also composed of adults from the village and young people from Mambo who work at AllKidsShouldPlay. We have realized the water supply by purchasing and constructing a water tank, water pump, pipelines and electricity.

Materials

Also in 2019 new materials were donated and purchased: four bicycles, bicycle helmets, balls and 13 tablets.
